I hereby Certify, That, from an examination of the Books and Documents, relating to Military Services in the War of the Revolution, which remain in the Warehouse, it appears that the name of Nathaniel Quincy is borne on a Muster Roll by Capt. Benjamin Conant's company in Col. Nathaniel Wood's regiment of having served as a Corporal from July 11th 1778 to ~~January 1st 1779~~ ^{December 31st 1778} and was paid for six months eight days service, including twelve days absent on his sick leave.

Declaration.

In order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress of the 7th of June, 1832.

On this *Twenty* day of *October* A. D. 1832 personally appeared *Nathaniel Stanley*
before me *Samuel Woodcock* a Justice of the Peace for said County *Washington* in
State, *Nathaniel Stanley* a resident of *Horton*
in the County of *Washington* and State of Maine, aged *eighty seven*
years, who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth on his oath make the following dec-
laration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress, passed
June 7, 1832. That he ^{was drafted} ~~enlisted~~ in the Army of the United States in the year 1778 with
Captain *Benjamin Lemont* and served in Col. *Wade's* regiment of
the *Massachusetts* line or troops under the following named officers:

Wade Col. That he was drafted as a ~~private~~ ^{private} in that company
& regiment in *April 1778* for eight months. That this period he
fully served out ^{his company} that he served at *Rhode Island*, was there
when the *French fleet* sailed out of the harbor, & when
Gen Sullivan retreated from the Island, & was verbally
discharged on *Warwick neck* in *Jan'y 1779*.

And to the interrogatories propounded under the instructions of the war department, he answers

That he was born at Atleborough, Mass in the year 1774 & presumes his age was there recorded. That during his revolutionary services his home was at Wentthrop, Maine. That he now lives in Horton, Maine, where he has lived for two years last past. That he was drafted & discharged as he has stated. That many of his neighbors will testify to his character for veracity & their belief of his services. That Caleb Croff of Tiptonboro, Me. is the only man he now knows as one who served with him. He has testified to his services during six months of the period of his service.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or an annuity, except the present, and he declares that his name is not on the Pension Roll of any agency in any State.
